Jeremiah listened to God so he would know what to tell the people. Jeremiah knew God loved the people and wanted them to obey and love Him again.

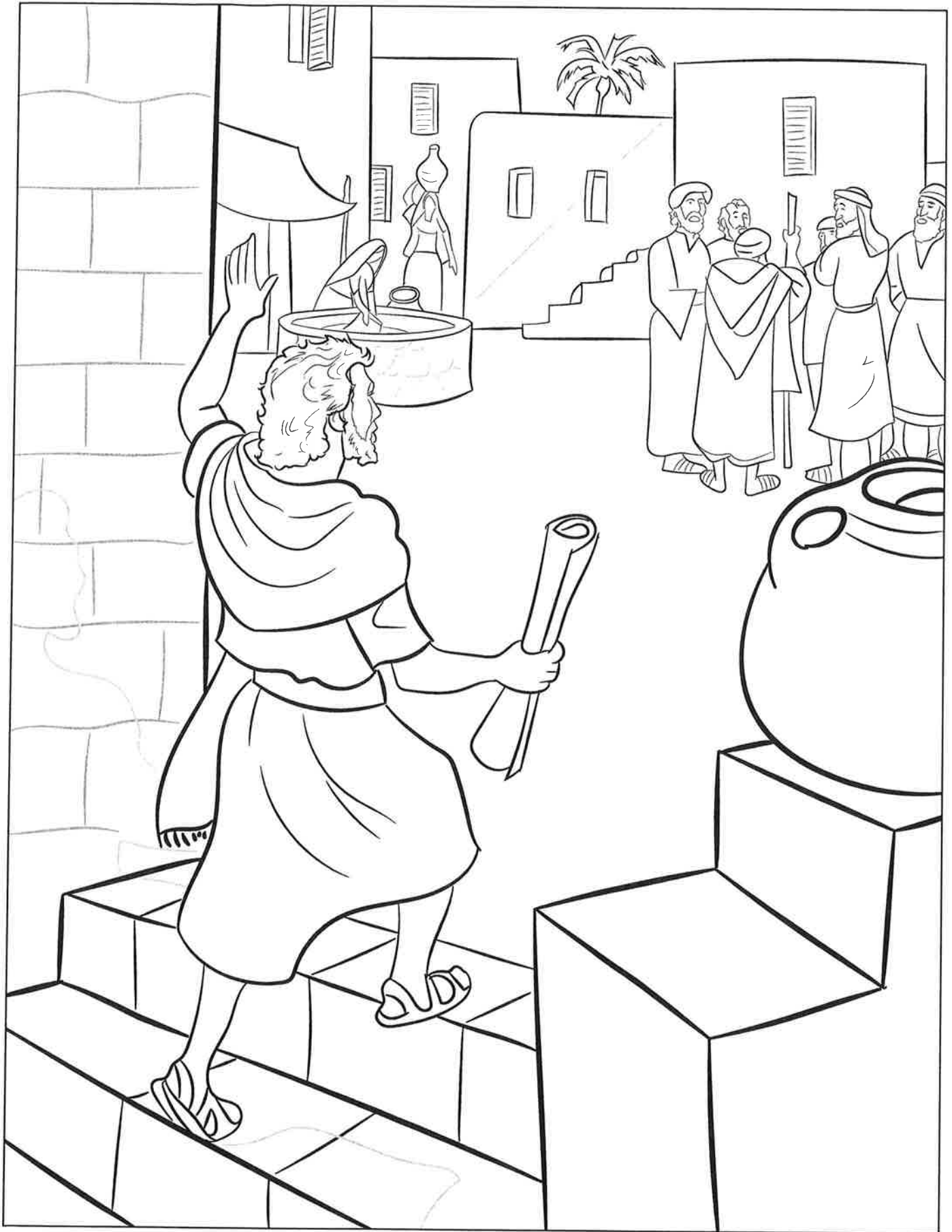

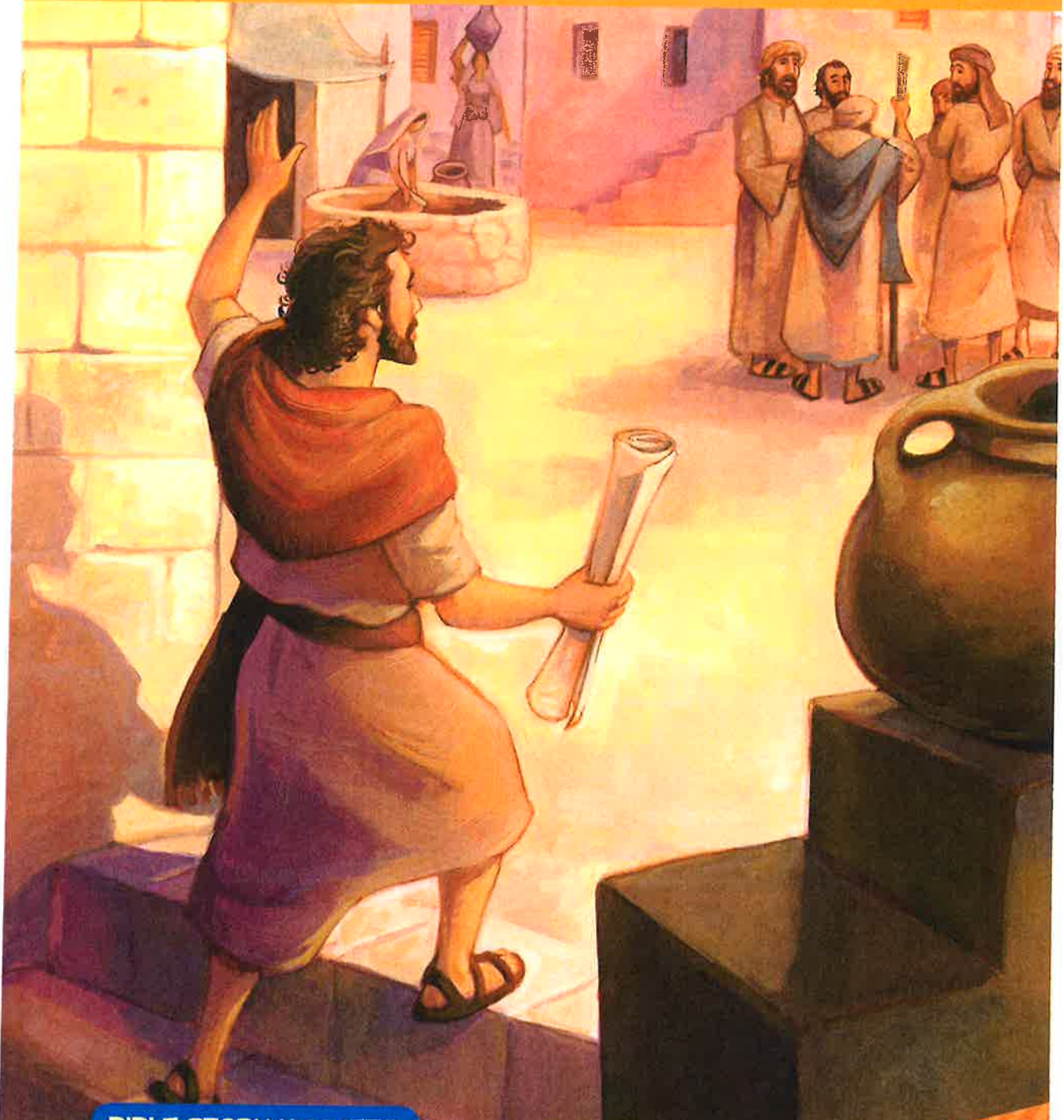

FAMILY ADVENTURE TOUCH AND HOLD A BIBLE

Babies need experience touching and holding a Bible. Some babies have small New Testaments or other gift Bibles that parents want to save and treasure. Consider getting a picture Bible just for your baby or toddler to use. Encourage her to hold the Bible, turn the pages, and look at the pictures. Pages may get torn, but they can be mended. The important outcome is that your child will learn that the Bible is a book for her.

FAMILY ADVENTURE READ THE BIBLE TOGETHER

Now is a wonderful time to begin a devotion time with your child. Strive to spend time each day using the Bible with your child. Keep the devotion short, but each time, remind your child that all the words in the Bible are true. Use this card and other pictures to tell stories from the Bible about real people who knew God and Jesus.
