## *As You Go*

These are simple questions to ask your students as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.

**.01 WHAT IS THE BEST STORY YOU HAVE READ, WATCHED, OR PLAYED RECENTLY? WHAT MADE IT A GOOD STORY?**

**.02 WHAT MAKES THE GOSPEL A GOOD STORY? WHAT TENSIONS IN LIFE ARE RESOLVED THROUGH JESUS’ LIFE, DEATH, AND RESURRECTION?**

## *Family Devotion*

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

**Summary: Romans 3:21-4:3**

This passage represents the turning point or the climax of the story Paul has been telling in his letter to Rome up to this point. Paul has laid out how both Jews (Rom. 2) and Gentiles (Rom. 1:18-32) are under God’s just wrath because of their willful rebellion against God. Things were not looking good. Thankfully, Paul begins Romans 3:21 with the words, “But now...” Today, we will see how God has offered a solution to our sin problem and the separation it causes between us and God.

**.01 HOW DOES THE GOSPEL DEMONSTRATE GOD’S RIGHTEOUSNESS?**

**.02 HOW SHOULD THE GOSPEL CHANGE THE WAY WE THINK ABOUT GOD, OURSELVES, AND OUR WORLD?**
