As You Go

.02 JESUS DID SOMETHING THAT NO ONE WILL EVER BE ABLE TO DO—HE ROSE FROM THE DEAD. WHAT DOES THAT TELL US ABOUT HIM? WHY IS IT GOOD NEWS?

Family Devotion

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

Summary: Luke 24:1-12

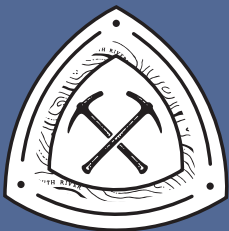
Of all the seemingly impossible feats that have been accomplished in human history, there is none more impressive than Jesus Christ's resurrection from the dead. This was truly impossible feat—no one but Jesus ever has or ever will rise from the dead. In this session, your student saw that Jesus' resurrection proved He was who He said He was—the Son of God and the Savior of all who believe. The resurrection reminds us that Jesus followed through with His promise to rise from the dead, proving He is the Son of God and Lord over all things.

Discussion Questions

.01 WHAT STANDS OUT TO YOU ABOUT LUKE'S ACCOUNT OF JESUS' RESURRECTION? WHY?

.02 WHAT DOES JESUS' RESURRECTION TELL US ABOUT HIM? HOW DOES IT GIVE US HOPE?

Pray: Thank God for conquering sin and the grave. Pray that you would root your hope for the future in Jesus alone.
