FAMILY BIBLE EXPLORATION

Share these points as you study Hebrews and Romans together as a family:



- **Live like Jesus.** The Book of Hebrews continuously reminds its readers to live like Jesus. Hebrews 12 also records that the faithful example of the people who lived previously, namely those mentioned in Hebrews 11, should also serve as examples for our lives. Living with the same type of faith those people displayed should encourage believers to boldly share the message of hope that comes through Jesus Christ.
- **Be obedient.** Faith is not the only necessity in our walk with God. God also wants us to be obedient to the things He asks of us. As Jesus was obedient even unto death, believers need to be obedient to the things God calls them to do. When obedience is key, God brings us closer to Him and spiritually shapes us to be more like Jesus.
- **Practical applications.** The Bible is full of practical applications that will help believers walk the straight line of obedience to God. The writer of Hebrews also shared some practical advice when the Hebrews were encouraged to live in peace with all people. Paul earlier identified that peace comes through the sacrifice of Christ and through Jesus' death, we can have peace. Exhibiting that peace through love to others and not instigating conflict will bring people to a closer walk with God. God is the author of peace, not conflict.
- **Be the example.** Paul echoed for the Romans the Hebrews writer's admonition to live in peace. Through peace, a believer can be known as someone who represents Christ to neighbors, friends, and coworkers. Paul called the Romans to be good citizens in their communities by being involved and fulfilling their obligations as good citizens. One way Paul told the believers they could do this was by showing love to those who lived around them. Showing Christlike love for other people will let others know of a believers commitment to follow God and desire to be like Him.
