Family Devotion

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

Summary: Romans 15:14-21, 30-33

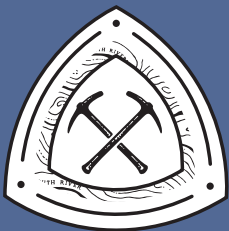
In this session students saw how God placed a burden on Paul's heart to take the gospel—the good news about Jesus' life, death, and resurrection—to the ends of the earth. God intends to receive more glory for Himself by calling people of different cultures and backgrounds to follow Him and submit to the lordship of Jesus. In this session, as we closed out our study of Romans, students saw that God calls us to share the good news with all people, particularly those who have never heard.

.02 WHAT ARE SOME WAYS WE CAN PARTICIPATE IN GOD'S PLAN FOR THE NATIONS?
