Summary: Proverbs 1:7-19

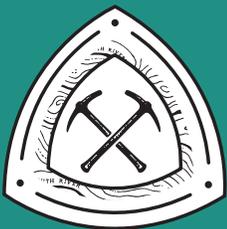

However, those who are truly wise don't just use knowledge to serve themselves. True wisdom means putting knowledge into practice in ways that honor God and that promote the good of the people around us. Today we will see that we can use knowledge to love God and serve others or to take advantage of them. One of these paths leads to life, but the other leads to ruin.
