HOLY PURPOSE

as you go

These are simple questions to ask your student as you go home from church or go about your weekly activities.

.01 What are some of our needs as human beings?

.02 Why do we need forgiveness of sin? How should knowing that God wants to forgive our sins give direction to our lives?

family DEVOTION

Consider following up with your student later in the week with the following summary and discussion questions.

summary: ISAIAH 6:1-13

“What do you live for?” How would you answer this question? Many people today would say that they live for the weekend, or for adventure, or to make money. Sadly, there are many people today who give little thought to what they live for. The answer to this question will deeply influence the shape of your life and its impact. In Isaiah 6:1-13 we see God meet Isaiah in a vision where Isaiah is immediately confronted with God’s holiness—His perfection and glory. By looking at this vision we will be challenged to consider what we live for. Our God is holy, and we must look to Him to forgive our sins and direct our lives.

discussion QUESTIONS

.01 How did the seraphim (powerful angelic beings) describe God? What does this tell us about God?

.02 How should knowing that God is holy and offers to forgive our sins shape how we live?

PRAY: Thank God for His holiness and ask Him to give direction and shape to your everyday life.

CENTRAL truth

Our God is holy, and we must look to Him to forgive our sins and direct our lives.
