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THE TEN COMMANDMENTS

EXODUS 19:3-6; 20:1-17

Moses and the people of Israel were camped in the desert. Moses was their leader. Moses was leading the people to a special land God had told them to find.

One day God told Moses to leave the camp and walk up a mountain. God wanted to talk to Moses.

God said, "Moses, tell the people to obey Me." God then gave the people some instructions so the people would know what to do.

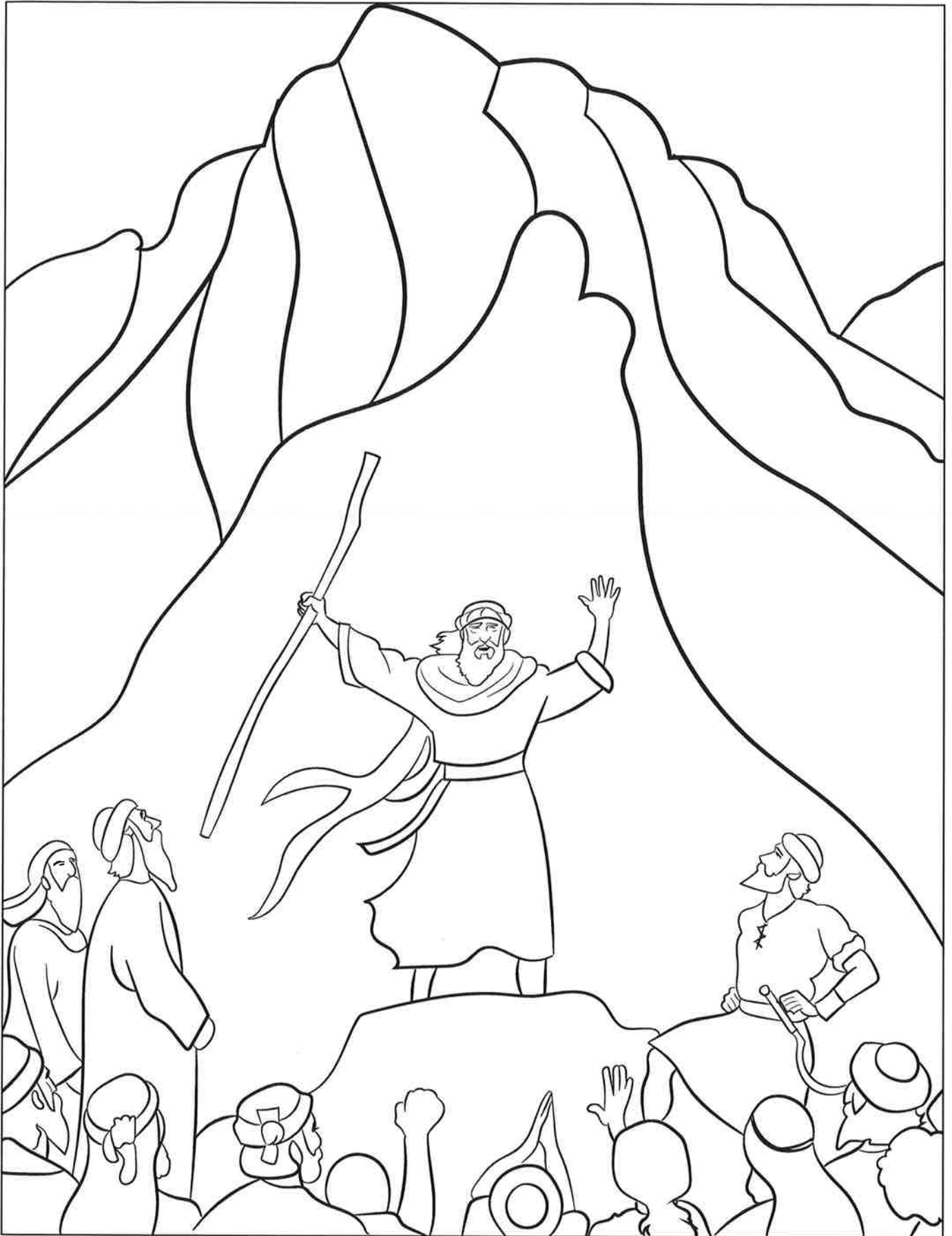

Today's Bible Story:

The Ten Commandments

Bible Text Truth:

God worked through Moses to rescue His people. Jesus was sent to rescue us from sin.



Bible Skills learned this week:

- The Bible teaches right and wrong.
- The Bible teaches what God is like.

Bible Focus @ Home:

God wanted His people to do what was right. Through Moses, God explained how His people were to live—first obey and worship God, then honor God through right relationships with others. Help your preschooler understand that the Ten Commandments and all God's rules are important. Include your preschooler in a simple family project around the house giving him something specific. Help your child learn to follow verbal directions and obey. Relate this to God's desire for us to read the Bible and learn what God wants us to do.

FAMILY BIBLE EXPLORATION

USE THESE ACTIVITIES AS YOU STUDY TOGETHER AS A FAMILY:



• **Go mountain climbing.**

Open your Bible to Exodus 19 and read verses 1-2. Talk about the mountain. Locate a picture of “Jebel Musa,” the traditional site of this story.

Talk about the features of this mountain and how it may differ from mountains near where you live. Say: “This mountain is where God gave Moses the Ten Commandments.”

Either make an obstacle course in your home, or go to a hill or trail where you can climb. Recall Moses climbing the mountain.

• **Illustrate the Ten Commandments.**

Open your Bible to Exodus 20 and review each of the Ten Commandments. Provide art supplies and instruct each of your family members to choose one of the commandments to illustrate.

After everyone has had time to create a poster for their commandment, give time for them to share what they created.

Say: “God gave these commands to the people so they would know how to love God and how to love other people.”

• **Make your own stone tablet.**

Use paper bags or other art supplies to make a tablet shape that looks like stone.

Once the tablet shapes are made, guide each family member to write one of the Ten Commandments onto the stone tablet. As each commandment is written, talk about why God would give that commandment and how it helps people relate to God or other people. Crumple the brown paper bags or use paint to make the desired stone look effect.

Pray, thanking God that He gives us help to know how to honor Him and others.
